

lawful at the request of either of the parties aforesaid for the said James Truant, his heirs, executors or administrators to expose to public sale (either in the premises or in the Town of Jerusalem) after giving at least twenty days notice at the Court house door of the County aforesaid by advertisement, the said tract or lot of land, or so much thereof as will be sufficient to pay and satisfy the sum or sums due, and so on and so forth whenever there is a failure or default, on the part of the said Henry B. Vaughan or refusal or delay of payment of any of the sums of money aforesaid, due to the said Trustee or their Successors, until the said sum with all reasonable and legal costs, be wholly paid and discharged. Out of the proceeds of the said sale or sales, first pay and satisfy all sums which shall appear to be due and owing to the said Trustees or their Successors, and all reasonable expenses incident thereto, and the surplus money if any, pay over to the said Henry B. Vaughan his heirs, executors or administrators or any other person duly authorized to receive the same and the said James Truant doth hereby covenant and agree to do with the said parties that he will well and truly do and execute the trust hereby reposed in him, grant, release, or give or grant a deed of conveyance, should it be required when required by either of the aforesaid parties.
