This Indenture made this
twenty sixth day of June one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, between
George Williams of Town of the County of Sampton of the one part James
Scott of the said County of the second part and Joseph Bottom of the said
County of Sampton of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said
George Williams stands justly indebted by note of hand to the said
James Scott in the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars current money
of the United States of America and whereas for the further
assurances of the payment, it is agreed by the parties hereto that
a conveyance in trust shall be made to the said Joseph Bottom
for the benefit of the said James Scott in case the said note of hand
shall not be punctually paid off with lawful interest thereon, on or
before the first day of February next. Now this Indenture witnesseth
that the said George Williams for and in consideration of the premises
and for the further sum of one Dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt
of which is acknowledged, has bargained and sold and by these
present doth for himself his heirs, executors and assigns give grant bargain and
sell unto the said Joseph Bottom his heirs and assigns all that
plantation tract and parcel of land whereon the said Geo. Williams
now lives being the same plantation tract and parcel of land
which Geo. Williams gave to his son the aforesaid George Williams
by his last will and Testament containing by estimation one
hundred and nineteen acres be the same more or less bounded
according to the known and reputed bounds thereof and also all
the buildings, woods, meadows, advantages and appurtenances to the
same in any wise belonging and the reversions, remainders
rents issues and profits thereof and all the estate right and
title of him the said George Williams of in and to the same
also one horse, eight cattle sixteen hogs twelve sheep, one cart &
wheeler, two feather beds and furniture two painted chests
two tables twelve chairs and two iron pots & hooks. To have and to
