the one part and Benjamin Weaver of the County of Edgecomb State of North
Carolina of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Lenox for and in
consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid
by the said Benjamin Weaver the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents have bargained
and sold unto the said Benjamin Weaver his heirs and assigns forever a
certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the Territory
of the Illinois, containing by estimation one hundred & sixty acres being
the south east quarter of Section twenty eight of township thirteen
north in range one east and number 9006 which the said
Henry Lenox purchased of John Weston & said thereof is recorded in
the clerk's office of Sampson County State of Virginia reference being
thereto made with more fully appears to have and to hold the said
land with the patents and the land therein described marks and laid
off with all the appurtenances thereto annexed together with all
and singular to the said land belonging or in any wise appertaining
to the same unto the said Benjamin Weaver his heirs and assigns forever
free from the claims of the said Henry Lenox his heirs & executors
and assigns & of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. Shallo
and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In testimony
