

John Washington

Isaac Bailey

This Indenture made this 25th day of July  
1781 between John Washington of the one part  
and Isaac Bailey of the other part both of the County  
of Southampton, Westchester that for and in consideration  
of Seventy four pounds to him in hand paid or otherwise  
before the sealing (and delivery of these presents, the receipt  
whereof is hereby acknowledged) hath granted bargained & sold  
doth by these presents grant bargain sell deliver enfeoff & confirm  
unto the said Isaac Bailey (for) one certain tract or parcel of  
land lying and being in the County aforesaid and adjoining the  
lands of said Washington and Anthony Andrews (it being a part  
of the land formerly belonging to Jague Bailey dec'd) bounded  
as follow: beginning at a spine in Anthony Andrews line  
a corner and running S 57. W 28 poles to a post oak, thence N 44  
W 14 2/3 poles to a red oak, thence N 57. W 28 poles to a post oak, thence  
N 81 W 24 poles to a black jack, thence N S. E. to a maple  
tree line in a branch, thence N. 39. E. 43 1/2 poles to a corner maple  
in Cornwells line and standing in Greens branch thence up a grass  
branch S 75. E. 49 2/3 poles to a red oak a corner near the path & thence  
S 30 W 73 poles along a row line of marked trees to the first station  
containing thirty seven acres, be the same more or less. To have  
and to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said  
Isaac Bailey (for) and his heirs and assigns to their proper use  
behalf forever and the said John Washington doth by these presents  
covenant and agree to and with the said Isaac Bailey that this  
present Deed of bargain and sale shall be unto him the said  
Isaac Bailey him, to his heirs and assigns a good and sufficient  
warrant against him the said John Washington and his heirs  
and assigns forever, as well as against the right title  
claim & demand of all and every other person or persons claiming  
by through or under him. In witness whereof the said John Washington  
with his hand and seal this day and year as above  
written and **XLII** year of American Independence
