This Indenture made this Twentieth day
of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen
between Branch W. Brattle of the County of Southampton of the one part
and Edward Brattle of the said County of the second part and Henry Briggs of the
said County of the third part Witnesseth that the said Branch W.
Brattle being justly indebted to the said Henry Briggs by bond bearing date
the 18th day of November 1819 for the sum of money four dollars and three
cents. And in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid
by the said Edward Brattle before the executing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said Branch W. Brattle
hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain
and sell unto the Edward Brattle the following property Viz: Three feather
bears and furniture clean selling chairs and square tables Silver spoons
One bay Horse and two feather bears and furniture to have and to hold the
said property hereinafore mentioned to be hereby granted to the said Edward
Brattle his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever Upon the
special trust nevertheless that the said Edward Brattle his heirs Exe-
cutors &c. when requested by either Henry Briggs or Branch W. Brattle
shall as soon as conveniently he can (after advising the time and place of sale
of the property before mentioned giving at least ten days notice
thereof to each of the said Henry Briggs & the highest bidder for the best
cash price that can be obtained and all of the money arising from
the sale of the said property first satisfy all reasonable charges allowed
such sale and the recording this Indenture and then the debt and interest
that may grow due thereon and the residue of the money arising from
such sale as aforesaid to the use of the said Branch W. Brattle his heirs
Executors or assigns or to such person or persons as he by writing under his
hand shall appoint and in default of such person or persons as aforesaid
he shall be entitled by virtue of the Statutes for distribution of intestates
estates In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed
our seals the day and Year above written
