This Indenture

made this 24th day of July in the Year one thousand eight hundred and nineteen by and between James Britte and Elizabeth his wife of the county of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Britton Britte of the same county and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Britte and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of seven hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Britton Britte before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge they the said James Britte and Elizabeth his wife have granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto him the Britton Britte his heirs and assigns forever all the right title interest and claim which they the said James Britte and Elizabeth his wife have in and to a certain tract or parcel of land being on the east side of Nottorray River (commonly called Britte lower place) containing by estimation one hundred and forty acres more or less sit being the tract of land which Britton Britte formerly purchased from Jordan Williams and by his last will and testament was devised in equal division to his two sons the aforesaid James Britte and Britton Britte bounded as mentioned in the deed from Jordan Williams to Britton Britte before mentioned Do Have and to hold the said bargained premises to him the said Britton Britte his heirs and assigns forever And they the said James Britte and Elizabeth his wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators do and will by these presents warrant and defend the said bargained premises against the lawful claims of all and every person whatsoever to whom the said Britton Britte his heirs and assigns forever In testimony whereof the said James Britte and Elizabeth his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their
