This Indenture made this twelfth day of February eighteen
 hundred and twenty between Edward Lundy of Southampton County and State of Virginia
 of the one part and John Foster of the said County of the other part Witnesseth
 that the said Edward Lundy being justly indebted William T Smith Allen for
 Benjamin Turner and Reuben Harris co-conspirators in the sum of Eleven hun-
 dred and twenty seven dollars for the purchase of a negro man and James Harris being
 the said Edward Lundy security and the said Edward Lundy being willing and
 bound to secure the payment of the same to the said James Harris or his assigns
 of the said debt for the purpose of releasing the said James Harris
 from security in consideration thereof and moreover for and in consideration
 the sum of one dollar at large in hand paid by the said John Foster
