This Indenture made this first day of December in the year of our Lord 1818 Between Joel Johnson and Sellar his wife of the county of Northampton North Carolina of the one part and Charles Harrison of the county of Southampton Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and eighty Dollars to us in hand paid by the said Charles Harrison the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold unto the said Charles Harrison one certain tract or parcel of land containing forty five Acres be the same more or less lying and being in the county of Southampton aforesaid and bounded as follows (to wit Beginning at a Black Gum a corner of Humphrey Drowys in the breadway marsh then along a line of marked trees to lightwood lake in said Drowys line thence along a line of marked trees a corner pine said Drowys corner thence along Wiley Drowys line to the said breadway marsh thence down on the said marsh to the beginning) it being a part of the land formerly belonging to Harris Johnson Decd. which said Land was the said Joel Johnson and Sellar his wife do warrant and defend the title of to said Harrison and his heirs forever against the claim of every person whatsoever In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and date above written
