This Indenture made this fourth day of October  
 in the year of our lord eighteenth hundred and twenty Between  
 Parham Wm. of the county of Southampton of the one part  
 and George Bloss of the county of Sussex of the other part Witnesseth  
 that the said Parham Wm. for and in consideration  
 of the sum of one thousand Dollars by the said George Bloss  
 to him the said Parham Wm. in hand paid at or before  
 the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof  
 as the said Parham Wm. hereby acknowledges and thereof  
 acquits and discharges him the said George Bloss his heirs  
 and administrators. Hath granted bargained sold alien  
 enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain  
 sell alien enfeoff and confirmed unto him the said George Bloss  
 his heirs and assigns one certain Mile on the Beacon tract  
 and the tract or parcel of land attached thereto situated  
 and being in the county of Southampton and State of Virginia  
 containing fifty acres lie the same more or less and accemph  
 ously therein with the privilege of holding as much water  
 in said Mile Pond as at its highest has been considered  
 a full head at any time It being the Mile which Purp  
 min Wm. of the said county of Southampton erected and  
 legally established on the said parcel of land attached hereto  
 and which he did survey and possessed of in fee simple  
 But dying intestate the said mile and tract or parcel of  
 land attached thereto with all their appurtenments and  
 right of waters in the pond he ceded the common property  
 of David Wm. and Mary his wife of the County  
 of Davidson and State of Tennessee to the said George Bloss
