arising from the sale of lands slaves and personal property devised and bequeathed
to the said Catharine Tupper Mead in her last will and testament Thomas Mead deceased
her father) when the said Catharine Thorne is now one of the age of twenty one
years and whereas they the said William Thorne and Catharine Thorne wife
for and consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds current money of
Virginia by the said Henry Senor to the said William Thorne and Catharine Thorne
his wife he has paid the receipt whereof the said William Thorne doth hereby
acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge Henry Senor his heirs his
the said William Thorne hath granted bargained sold aliened transferred
by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien and transfer unto the
said Henry Senor his heirs and assigns forever all their right title interest
claim or demand whatsoever to the said several devise and bequests in the
said last will and testament of Thomas Mead deceased which the said
William Thorne has in right of his said wife Catharine Thorne and which
he now is entitled to his said wife Catharine Thorne having attained to the age
of twenty one years and also all the right title interest claim or demand whatsoever
which may hereafter accrue to him in right of his said
wife by the death or deaths of the other two devisees of
Thomas Mead deceased or any of them to the devisees and legatees
respectively given them in the said last will and testament
together with all and every advantage emolument and interest in any
manner appertaining to or to be devised from the estate of the said
Thomas Mead deceased To Have and to Hold to the said Henry
Senor his heirs and assigns forever in as ample a manner as the
said William Thorne would or could have done the in case
this conveyance had never been made and the said William
Thorne in right of his said wife for themselves and their heirs
the said devisees and legatees and every part thereof against themselves
and their heirs and against all and every other person and
persons whatsoever to the said Henry Senor does shew and
well warrant and forever defend by these presents In witness
whereof the said William Thorne and Catharine Thorne his wife have
hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and
