 said David Harris & Spradley Williams who their heirs executors
 administrators or assigns on the first day of January 1820 that
 then the said Thomas E. Holladay his heirs executors or administrators
 after giving weekly and Notices by advertisement expose the
 aforesaid property to public sale for cash and with the money
 arising therefrom first pay and satisfy the sum above
 mentioned with interest accruing thereon and cost as
