This Indenture made this 15th day of January
1821 Between James Darden of the county of Montgomery
State of Tennessee of the one part and Edwin G Hart of the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part
witnesseth that the said James Darden for and consideration
of the sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid
before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith
fully satisfied contented and paid have granted bargained
and sold allend and confirmed and by these presents doth
grant bargain sell assign and confirm unto him the said
Edwin G Hart one certain tract or parcel of land lying
and being in the County of Southampton and containing
by estimation twenty five and one half acres be the
same more or less parts lying on the South Side of Black
water river and bounded by the said river the lands of
Jacob Darden and Richard Darden It being the lot
of Land assigned to the said James Darden in the division
of the lands of which his father Jacob Darden sur. decd.
said Survey and proposed as well appear by the report of the
commissioners filed in the clerk's office of Southampton County
Court To Have And to hold the said bargained premises
to him the said Edwin G Hart his heirs and assigns forever
together with all and singular the appurtenances profits and
emoluments to the same in any manner belonging And
witness whereof he the said James Darden hath hereunto
set his hand and affixed his seal the day and date before
written Signed sealed &
acknowledged in the presence of James Darden
