

This Indenture

made this 28th day of October
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two
 Matthew Johnson of Northampton County North Carolina of the one part
 and Humphrey Drury of Southhampton County Virginia of the other
 part witnesseth that he the said Matthew Johnson for and in consideration
 of the sum of one thousand and sixty dollars to him in
 hand paid by the said Humphrey Drury the receipt whereof
 is hereby fully acknowledged that he the said Matthew Johnson
 doth grant bargain sell convey confirm and make over unto the said
 Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land
 containing forty acres less the same more or less which land was
 left to be sold in Judith Johnson's will after her death
 situated lying and being in County of Southhampton aforesaid
 bounded last following Beginning at a gum in the Prady marsh
 a corner of Judith Johnson's aforesaid land thence along the line of
 said aforesaid land to a Poplar in said line from thence to a Stake at
 the side of the Smoke House a corner in Charles Harrison's line
 from thence to a large black gum in a small Branch a corner
 of Charles Harrison's and William Harrison's from thence to two small
 Persimmon trees a corner of said Drury and Thomas Lipsett from
 thence down the run of the said Prady marsh to the Beginning
 To Have and to Hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all its
 appurtenances thereto unto the said Humphrey Drury his
 heirs and assigns forever together with all the rights profits privi-
 leges therunto belonging and the said Matthew Johnson doth
 for himself and his heirs covenant and agree with the said
 Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns to warrant defend
 the said Land unto the said Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns
 as forever free and clear from all incumbrances whatever
 he witnesseth whereof he have hereunto set his hand & affixed his
 Seal this day and year above written Signed Sealed and acknow-
