day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred

ministrators and assigns and every of them from by these
presentes the said Horn and wife hath granted bargained
sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presentes doth
grant and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said
Apprentice his heirs and assigns forever all that certain tract
or parcel of land with the appurtenances situate lying being
in the County of Southampton containing 34 Acres less the same
more less and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a red
oak in H S Smithbrooks line thence along the said Westbrooks
line to a black oak in Thomas Dickes line thence along the
Dickes line to a corner a post oak in Benjamin Apprentices
line thence along the said Apprentices line to a pine a corner
the said Harry Apprentices thence along the said Apprentices
to the beginning and the reversion and reversions remainder
and remainders of all and singular the said tract or parcel of
land and premises hereby granted or mentioned to be hereby
granted and of every part and parcel thereof and all the and
issues services profits to the same or any part or parcel thereof
incident belonging or appertaining after also all and every the estate
and estate rights titles claims interest and demands whatsoever
of him the said Horn and wife in to or out of the said tract
of land and every part and parcel thereof To Have and to hold

granted bargained and sold or mentioned or intended to be hereby
granted bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof
