Whereas Thomas Wood Late late of the County of Southampton  
did testate seized area proposed of lands lying in the said County of  
Southampton and proposed also of personal testate the whole of which  
lands the said Thomas Wood Late by his last will and testament  
devised to Mary Wood his widow until the arrival of his children  
to the age of twenty one years at which time he directs his lands  
to be divided into three equal parts one third of which was to  
remain in the possession of his said widow during his natural  
life and the other two thirds to be sold and the proceeds of the sale  
to be equally divided among his children his son Benjamin Wood  
excepted after the one third which he devised to his said widow during  
his natural life after the arrival of his children to the age of twenty one  
years to be sold at the death of his said widow and divided in like  
manner among his children and whereas the said Thomas Wood Late in  
his said last will and testament bequeathed to his said widow  
during his natural life several slaves stock of Horses cattle sheep  
Hogs and various articles of household furniture still &c.  
which he directs to be sold after the death of his said widow and  
the money arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided  
among his children excepting his son Benjamin Wood all which  
will more fully appear reference being had to the said last  
will and testament of Thomas Wood Late which is on record in  
the County Court of Southampton aforesaid and whereas all the children  
of said Thomas Wood Late have arrived to the age of twenty one years and  
Henry Denon hath purchased of Daniel Wood and Horland Wood  
two of the sons of said Thomas Wood Late and of William Thorn +  
Catharine Bond his wife late Catharine Bond Wood a daughter  
of said Thomas Wood Late and also of Mary Wood widow of said  
Thomas Wood Late all their respective rights and interests in the  
lands to as aforesaid devised by the said Thomas Wood Late  
as well in possession of remainder or reversion and whereas the  
said Henry Denon hath also purchased of the said Daniel Wood  
Horland Wood and William Thorn and Catharine his wife late  
Catharine Bond Wood all their right and interest in their respective  
proportions of the personal estate of said Thomas Wood Late including  
their interest in that which was bequeathed to the said Mary  
Wood during her natural life which will more fully appear  
reference being had to the deeds from the aforesaid <sup>Original</sup>  
all of which are of record in the County Court of Southampton aforesaid and whereas the said <sup>Original</sup>  
the said Henry Denon hath contracted and agreed with  
certain Thomas Gray to sell and convey to him the right  
title and all the interest whatsoever which the aforesaid  
Daniel Wood Horland Wood William Thorn and his wife  
Catharine and Mary Wood had in the lands so devised
