hundred and ninety one between William Clark alias Nancy the wife of the County of
Southampton of the one part and James Brewson of the other part Notwithstand
that for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand Dollars so due in hand
paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold
and by these presents as grant bargained sold and confirmed unto the said
James Brewson one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being on
the South side of the three creeks and in the County aforesaid Containing by
late Survey one hundred forty and two acres to the shore more or less unto
bound'd by the land of Harry Nichols and Humphrey Drury Harry Harris
and the three creeks with all the benefit improvements fixtures belonging
which said land the said William Clark and Nancy his wife as warrant
and defend the right title of to said Brewson and his heirs forever against
the claims of any person whatsoever for nothing wherof we have foreseen
of our knowl'dge and since the day and date above written
