This Indenture made the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighth between Michael Harris of the one part and Benjamin Marks of the other part witnesseth that I the said Michael Harris for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and four dollars to me in hand paid by the said Marks the receipt whereof the said Harris doth acknowledge to the said Benjamin Marks his heirs and assigns forever a certain parcel of Land Beginning as follows To wit at a new corner made in Michael Harris line at 70 E 38 is a small pine chumee at 70 E 38 is a small pine at the gum Spring chumee at 38 E 66 is a gum chumee up the various curves of the swamp to an ash Post N. 24 pole to a pine in William Drury's line thence North 53 N. 20 pole to three black oaks a corner of said William Drury's line thence S. 27 N. 87 pole to the beginning To have and to hold the said meadow or tract and all and singular the premises above mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Benjamin Marks his heirs and assigns forever and I the said Michael Harris doth for myself my heirs executors and assigns this title unto the said Benjamin Marks Grant and defend against all persons whatever
