This Indenture made this 13th day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty one between Benjamin Shurt and Margaret his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Henry Gurley of the said County of the other part witnesseth that the said Benjamin Shurt and Margaret his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to them the said Shurt in hands paid by the said Gurley the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell and confirm unto the said Henry Gurley his heirs and assigns forever one sixth part of a Lot of Land in the town of Jerusalem of Southampton County known by the name of Reels Tavern and joins Harts Tavern and is supposed to contain ten acres by reference being had to the clerks office the boundaries might be ascertained. To have and to hold the said one sixth part of said Lot of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any way appurtenant to them the said Henry Gurley his heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin Shurt and Margaret his wife for themselves their heirs executors administrators and assigns doth Covenant and agree to and with the said Henry Gurley his heirs executors administrators or assigns to warrant and defend the title of the said one sixth part of the said premises against the claim or demand of any person or persons whatsoever in witness whereof the said Benjamin Shurt and Margaret his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written.
