This Indenture made this 21st day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and twenty between John T. Blon of the first part Henry P. Naughton
 of the second part and William E. Daughton of the third part all of the County
 of Saunderhampton and State of Virginia Whereas that whereas the said John T.
 Blon stands justly indebted to the said Henry P. Naughton in the sum of five hundred
 and eighty nine dollars and eighty cents by his personal bearing
 equal debt with these presents and the said John T. Blon being willing and desirous
 to secure the payment of the aforesaid sum of money with interest thereon
 interest thereof to the said Henry P. Naughton and for and satisfaction of the
 sum of one dollar to him the said John T. Blon in hand paid by the said William
 E. Daughton the receipt whereof the said John T. Blon doth hereby acknowledge
 hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain
 and sell unto the said William E. Daughton his heirs and assigns
 forever three negro men named following to wit Henry (commonly called
 Hal) Ephraim and Ellick to him the said William E. Daughton his heirs
 executors administrators and assigns forever upon this special condition
 and condition that in the said William E. Daughton his heirs executors
 shall at any time at the request of either the said Henry P. Naughton or the
 said John T. Blon sell the aforesaid negroes Henry Ephraim and Ellick
 after giving ten days public notice of the time and place of sale of said
 negroes at public sale to the highest bidder for cash and out of the proceeds
 of such sale pay and satisfy the aforesaid sum of five hundred and
 eighty nine dollars and eighty cents with two percent premium accruing
 thereon and all cost and charges attending the said sale and the cost of
 recording these presents and the surplus of any pay over to the said John T. Blon
 his heirs executors admors or assigns and the said John T. Blon doth hereby warrant
 and defend the said title of said negroes to the said William E. Daughton
 his heirs admors or assigns against himself his heirs executors admors or assigns and against all and
 every other person whatsoever in testimony whereof the parties to these presents hath hereunto
 set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written signed sealed
 acknowledged in presence of
