This Indenture made and entered into the 22nd of March 1821 Between Elisha Williams
 and Elizabeth Williams his wife of the first part and William Williams of the third
 part witnesses that whereas the said Elisha Williams being desirous and anxious of
 the love and affection which he received to his situation William Williams to make some
 provision for him and at the same time to retain a decent maintenance for himself
 during his own life hath given granted bargained and sold conveyed released and confirmed
 and by these presents doth give grant bargain bargain and sell release and confirm
 unto Edwin Turner all the tract of land for which I live in the County of Southampton
 bounded by the Swamp called the Buck Horn the land of Joshua Johnson and
 Thomas Foster containing one hundred and forty five acres more or less also three negroes
 one named Jacob one named Lucy and one named Pottle to him and his heirs
 forever upon this special trust to wit that the said Edwin Turner will and in
 the premises and make such disposition of the property as may be for the interest
 of the said Elisha Williams as respects in the premises and all the past and here
 after unpaid and to the said Elisha Williams hereby given and granted the right
 and title to the said land and negroes against the claims or claims of himself
 and those claiming under him and against the lawful claims or claims of all
 and every person or persons whatsoever And the said Edwin Turner covenants for
 himself his heirs successors or assigns that he will permit the said Elisha Williams
 and his occupying negroes and receive the benefit of the said land and negroes
 above conveyed in as ample a manner as if the same had never been conveyed
 to him by the said Elisha Williams for and during the natural life of the said
 Elisha Williams and of the said Elizabeth Williams should survive the
 said Elisha then to permit the said Elizabeth to live and enjoy the same in like
 manner as is permitted to the said Elisha during his life upon this special condition
 nevertheless that the property of the said Elisha Williams or Elizabeth his wife or not by
 any means to be considered as devised to that of the said Edwin Turner or in such
 manner as to create any right and title in the said Elisha or Elizabeth herself to the
 property above conveyed other than that contemplated in this deed and the said
 Edwin Turner further covenants for himself his heirs successors to that he will upon
 the death of the said Elisha Williams and Elizabeth his wife or the survivor
 of them make an absolute conveyance of the aforesaid property to the said Williams
 or to his heir or heirs as the case may be he his heirs or their heirs forever
 thereby transferring this deed and relinquishing all his right title or interest in any
 divided part of this same And the said Williams Williams on his part covenants
 for himself his heirs to that he will not attempt by his enterprises in any
