Know all men by these presents that I Mary Wood of the County of
Southampton for and consideration of the just and full sum of one thousand
and fifty dollars unto me on hand paid by Thomas Gray of the County of Essex
and the receipt whereof I the said Mary Wood do acknowledge by these
presents have granted bargained sold and delivered all my right title and
interest in and to the following property as well as effect which was devised
and bequeathed to me by the last will and testament of my husband
Thomas Wood deceased as any other herein named and by these
presents doth grant bargain sell and deliver the same as follows to wit
Two Negroes Slaves named Stephen and Mary free Grather. One testamentary
and furniture therein belonging three Walnut Tables one sitting
Chair three pine Chest and a Copper Cup board one ornamental candle three
three painted dishes three painted plates three iron pots one frying pan and
Lemon and all the Hardware and gear with wrapping like kind house two
Cows and Lambs one work shop for Cows one spring one calf one Car and
wheels two axes two mending hoes one grubbing edge one lifting bar two
ridges two Spinning wheels one flax wheel and Hackle spinning and
reversing the use of the said of the aforesaid Slaves Stephen and Mary for the
presents year To have and to hold the property as aforesaid unto the said
Thomas Gray his heirs Executors administrators or assigns in as full and
Complete a manner as I the said Mary Wood could or should have
done by this Indenture of Mortgaging which had been made or executed
lawfully and reverently the use for him of said Slaves as aforesaid and
I the said Mary Wood for myself my heirs Executors and administra-
tors do covenant and agree to satisfy with the said Thomas Gray his
heirs Executors administrators and assigns to warrant and forever defend
to the said Thomas Gray his heirs Executors administrators and assigns
the property aforesaid against the claim or claims demands or demands
of all persons living present or persons whatsoever In testimony whereof the
said Mary Wood hereunto set my hand and affixed of my
seal this twenty fourth day of March in the year one thousand eight
