This Indenture made and entered into this 14th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one between Henry J. Westbrook, Spratley Williams of the second part and Thomas Bottle of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the said Thomas M. Bottle by his Deed bearing date the 17th day of December 1819 and duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton on the 21st day of March 1820 in order to secure the payment of a certain sum of money then due and to be paid by the said Henry J. Westbrook with the interest thereon amounting to the said Spratley Williams as Trustee for the benefit of the said Westbrook a certain Tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing only eight and three fourths hundred by the lands of John A. Nichols the land belonging to the Estate of Benjamin Lewis Charles Westbrook and Thomas Boston; and it appearing that the said sum of two hundred and seventy five dollars and a half with the interest thereon as per all the cash and sums of money for which the aforesaid Deed in trust was made to secure have been fully paid and discharged by the said Thomas M. Bottle to the said Henry J. Westbrook both request that the said land which was conveyed
