This Indenture made the 20th day of March in the year of our said
 1821 between Jesse Dracey and Jane his wife of the County of Southampton &
 State of Virginia of the one part and Thomas E. Brooks of the same county
 and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Jesse Dracey and Jane
 his wife in consideration of fifty dollars of lawful money of this common-
 wealth to them in hand paid by the said Thomas E. Brooks at or before the
 making and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have bargained and sold unto by these presents as bargain and sell unto the
 said Thomas E. Brooks his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land sit-
 ting the said land Jesse Dracey purchased of said Thomas E. Brooks bounded as
 follows viz Beginning at a poplar tree standing in Barnabas Drakes land in
 the branch thereof up the said branch across the road up to a white oak standing
 in Thomas Pastors line thence along a line of marked trees to a pine a corner tree
 standing in Henry Cherrys line the Elongate Quers line and down the said line
 line to a pine a corner tree standing in Barnabas Drakes line thence
 through a meadow down the Horse Bone Branch to the road thence
 across the road down to the Branch to the beginning containing by estimation
 forty acres be the same more or less together with all and singular the appurtenances
 whatsoever and the revenues and profits thereon and the same premises more and
 other rents issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to
 hold the said forty acres of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and
 singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be mentioned
 against sales and any part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members
 and appurtenances unto the said Thomas E. Brooks his heirs and assigns
 forever and the said Jesse Dracey and Jane his wife for themselves their heirs
 the said forty acres of land with all and singular the premises appurtenances
 before mentioned unto the said Thomas E. Brooks his heirs and assigns free
 from the claim or claims of them their or either of their heirs and of all and
 every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do now or hereafter
 by these presents in witness whereof the said Jesse Dracey & Jane his
