This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of \$259. 50. this day paid unto the said Barnes by the said Joseph P. Joynes he the said Jacob Barnes have granted bargained sold released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain Release and confirm unto him the said Joseph P. Joynes his heirs and assigns forever all the right title interests and Estate whatsoever. In and to a certain tract or parcel of land which the said Joseph P. Joynes previously conveyed in Deed to him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs executors and administrators by a Deed bearing date May the 11th 1820 to secure the payment of a certain debt due and owing to the above named Barnes of the said Joseph P. Joynes and to satisfy accounts thereon amounting to the sum above mentioned being paid (of of course) and I do hereby warrant and defend the right and title of the said Joseph P. Joynes having reference to the said Deed in Deed bearing date as aforesaid against the claim of myself and my heirs in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and date above written signed sealed and delivered in presence of

This Indenture made this 7th day of June in the year of our Lord 1821 between Sally Bewell of the one part and Robert Goodwyn of the other part both of the county of Southampton witnesseth that the said Sally Bewell for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred dollars is due in hands due to the said Robert Goodwyn hath granted bargained sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Robert Goodwyn a certain tract or parcel lying and being in the county of Southampton containing six hundred acres to the same more or less beginning at a given in woods and bounded by the lands of said Robert Goodwyn James Gray and others being the lands which the said Sally Bewell bought of Benjamin Hanthorn to have and to hold to the said Robert Goodwyn the said six hundred acres of land and the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Robert Goodwyn and his heirs and the said Sally Bewell for herself her heirs executors and administrators the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances to him the said Robert Goodwyn his heirs and assigns shall and well warrant and forever defend.
