This Indenture made and entered into this eighteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty between for and of Mordough Amos Joyner and James Jones Commissioners appointed by the county court of Southampton to make sale of the two acres of land belonging to the Estate of John Adely deceased all of the County aforesaid and parish of Stoney of the one part and Thomas Joyner of the same county and parish who became Trustee of the property of the other part Witnesseth that the said Special Mordough Amos Joyner and James Jones Commissioners aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Harrison Joyner agreed to the acquisition of the piece aforesaid the receipt of which the said for and of Mordough Amos Joyner and James Jones Commissioners as aforesaid do hereby acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid. And do hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Joyner his heirs and assigns forever an certain tract or parcel of land and premises situated lying and being in the county and parish aforesaid containing by Estimation three acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows (To wit) beginning at a pine a corner of Joshua Dryatts land thence thence bounded by the said Dryatts land to a red oak a corner of said land thence bounded by Parks line to a red oak a corner of said land from thence bounded by Amos Joyners land to the first station together with all houses and lands belonging unto the said Joyner and Archard or any water and water courses whatsoever belonging or in any way appertaining to the said land or parcel of land do promise to have and to hold the same unto and the said Harrison Joyner to him and his heirs forever as the
