This Indenture made this 15th day of August in the year one thousand
 eight hundred and twenty one Between William & Everett of the first
 part Thomas Musson of the second part and John Middleton of the
 third part all of the County of Southampton Witnesses that whereas
 the said William & Everett is this day indebted to the said Thomas
 Musson in the sum of five thousand six hundred dollars six hundred
