This Indenture made this 29 day of May in the year eighteen
 hundred and twenty and between Thomas Fitts of Southampton County
 and State of Virginia of the one part and Gattleton Williamson of said
 County of the other part Manifesteth that the said Thomas Fitts being
 justly indebted to Arthur Williamson of the aforesaid County in the
 full and full sum of eighty three pounds 13^s and the said Thomas
 Fitts being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the said
 sum to the said Arthur Williamson whereof and moreover for
 and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid the
 receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged the said Thomas
 Fitts hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 doth give grant bargain and sell and make over unto the said
 Gattleton Williamson and his heirs forever the following property
 to wit two short guns one Wagon many stacks of tools includ-
 ing the tools Gattleton Williamson bought of Nathaniel Fitts for one
 three feather beds and furniture 2 tables one desk four Hives and Bee
 hive 2 broad stoves 6 sitting chairs 12 picture plates 5 picture desks
 several earthen plates 1 set knives and forks 4 earthen bowls 3 pig
 gins 5 pole saws several lumber and old tools at A. Williamson's
 to Have and to Have the said property unto the said Gattleton
 Williamson his heirs and assigns the same in trust for said Arthur
 Williamson his heirs ~~for~~ for the express purpose of paying the
 said Arthur Williamson the sum of Eighty three pounds 13^s it is
 hereby agreed and declared to be the true intent and meaning
 of this indenture that if the said sum as above specified be not
 paid unto the said Arthur Williamson his heirs or assigns within
 one year and cost thereon on or before the fifth day of
 June next ensuing the date hereof then the said Arthur
 Williamson shall be at full liberty at any time thereafter
 when it may suit him the said debt or any part thereof
