This Indenture was proved by the oaths of Elias Summerville William Parley and Thomas Stone of the said county and admitted to record and at a Court held for the aforesaid County of Southampton on the 17 September 1821 this Indenture as aforesaid was entered upon the proceedings of the day Teste James Stochelle.

Crumpler and wife to Virgubart

That Indenture made the Eleventh day of January in the year of our Lord English hundred and twenty and William Second Crumpler and Elizabeth Crumpler his wife of the one part and John Virgubart of the other parts all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said William Crumpler and Elizabeth Crumpler his wife in consideration of the sum of seven hundred dollars Lawfull money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said John Virgubart at or before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John Virgubart this his and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows To wit by the main run of Black water river on the East by the main run of deacock on the South by the lands of William Crumpler and on the West and by the lands of Major Simon Boykin on the North to the main run of Black water to the beginning containing by Estimation one hundred and fifty acres more or less together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the revenues and revenues or remainder and remainds yearly and other rents fees and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining unto him or his intended heirs bargain and sold and every part and parcel thereof unto the said John Virgubart his heirs assigns forever to and for the only use and behoof
