This Indenture made this fourth day of August one thousand eight hundred and  
 forty one between Benjamin Setts and Martha his wife of the County of  
 S. Ampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Parham Moore of the  
 same County and State of the other part witnesseth that the said Benjamin Setts  
 and Martha his wife for and consideration of ten dollars current money of  
 Virginia have sold and conveys unto Parham Moore his heirs and assigns  
 a tract of Land containing ten acres more or less and bounded as follows  
 lying on the south side of the Jackson Swamp in the County of Southampton  
 beginning at a white oak a faze and oft tree of Thomas Morris line  
 thence north a straight course to the main run of the Jackson Swamp  
 thence up the various Courses and minnings of the said swamp to Peter  
 Mawry line thence south along the said Mawry line to the out edge of  
 the mill Pond at the height of holding nine feet rods at George Adams  
 mill thence down the edge of the mill pond in all its various Courses and  
 windings to Tans branch to the said Morris line thence down the said line to  
 a white oak began at to have and to hold all and singular the land and  
 premises above mentioned unto the said Parham Moore his heirs and assigns  
 forever and the said Benjamin Setts and Martha for themselves and their  
 heirs make warrant and forever defend by these presents In witness whereof  
 we have hereunto set our hands the said Benjamin Setts and  
 Martha his wife have hereunto set their hands and
