This Indenture made this fourth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty one between Benjamin Selks and Martha his wife of the County of F. Ampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Barham Mann of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Selks and Martha his wife for and in consideration of the dollars current money of Virginia have sold and confirmed unto Barham Mann his heirs and assigns a tract of Land containing two acres more or less and bounded as follows lying on the south side of the Rackoon Swamp in the County of Southampton beginning at a white oak a fence and a ft tree of Thomas Manns line thence north a straight Course to the main river of the Rackoon Swamp thence up the various Courses and minings of the said Swamp to Peter Manns line thence south along the said Manns line to the out edge of the mile Pond at the height of holding nine feet gales at George Adams mill thence down the edge of the mile pond in all its various Courses and windings to Saw branch to the said Manns line thence down the said line to a white oak to a gap at to have and to hold all and singular the Land and premises above mentioned unto the said Barham Mann his heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin Selks and Martha for themselves and their heirs mile warrant and forever defend by these presents to the said Barham Mann his heirs and assigns the said Benjamin Selks and Martha his wife have hereunto set their hands and
