This Indenture made this twentieth day of July in the year eighteen hundred and twenty one between Mary Jones of the first part James D. Mapenlunge of the second part and Thomas C. Jones of the third part Whereas the said Mary Jones is justly indebted to the said Thomas C. Jones the sum of forty three dollars and by note bearing date the first day of January on demand the twenty fifth of December this present year and also one other note for the sum of forty eight dollars and by note bearing date and on demand the 1st day of June in this present year And this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar to the said Mary Jones in hand paid by the said James D. Mapenlunge the said Mary Jones hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said James D. Mapenlunge his heirs and assigns forever One negro man slave named Willie to have and to hold the said slave unto him the said James D. Mapenlunge his heirs and assigns forever and the said Mary Jones doth hereby covenant and grant for herself and heirs to warrant and defend the title to the said slave Willie unto him the said James D. Mapenlunge against the claims or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever Upon trust nevertheless that the said James D. Mapenlunge will permit the said Mary Jones to remain in possession and enjoy the profits of said slave until default be made in the payments of her debts and then upon this further trust that he his executors administrators or assigns shall and will as soon after the happening of such default as he his executors administrators or assigns shall request sell the said slave to the highest bidder for ready money at auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and given ten day notice thereof at two or more publick places and out of the moneys arising from such sale after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Thomas C. Jones the amount of the above written note with such interest as may have accrued thereon and the balance shall pay over unto the said Mary Jones her executors or assigns But if the said debts be punctually paid until the said Thomas C. Jones on or before the 25th day of December in the year eighteen hundred and twenty one then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue in witness whereof
