

Darson for the same by paying to him as well his commissions for selling them as all other incidental costs and then paying the net amount of sales to wit One thousand three hundred and sixty Dollars and 25 cents to the credit of the notes which remained unpaid as aforesaid which sum fully paid off the first of these notes and carried to the credit of the other two hundred and two dollars and 50 cents under the date of these presents 1820 therefore this Indenture testeth that for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid he the said Jacob Darson hath granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said Richard Darson his heirs and assigns forever all and singular the Lands and Tenements above described and mentioned excepting only the Ferry before mentioned to have and to hold the said bargained premises to him the said Rich^d Darson and his heirs and assigns forever And he the said Jacob Darson for himself his heirs Executors and administrators doth and well warrant and affirms the title of the before mentioned property except as is above excepted so far as under the Authority of the Deed in Trust aforesaid he lawfully may do against the claims or claims of all and every person whatsoever to him the said Richard Darson and to his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof he the said Jacob Darson hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first before written signed sealed and attested in the presence of
