This Indenture made and entered into the seventeenth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between James Murphy & Lewis his wife of the one parts and Lewis C. Frequent of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Murphy and Lydia his wife in consideration of truly paid hundred and fifty dollars current money have bargained and sold and by three presents do and each of them do sell bargain and sell unto the said Lewis C. Frequent his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing three hundred and sixty acres three and a space more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at a small white oak on the road side a corner for Abraham Pearson and thence thence to an old stump another corner for the same thence along the flat swamp or pond to the swamp up the various courses of the same to a small black gum in said swamp at an old dam and a corner for James Vaughan Thomas Murky and John Lott thence along a new line between John Mills and James Murphy to a large pine an Elbow tree containing said line to a large red oak a corner for James Edwards thence to a small red oak bush corner for Wells Murphy thence to a small pasture corner for Wells Murphy James Murphy and O. Edwards thence into the flat Pond again and along the Course of the Pond and from the Pond to a red oak corner for O.
