This Indenture made this 17th day of January in the year of our Lord
 Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between David Mathews
 Humphrey Drury John Mathews George Perry Commissioners appointed by
 the County Court of Southampton to make sale of $\frac{1}{3}$ of the Tunes wherein
 James Dour and seized and Possessed which order bears date December 21st 1821
 all of the said Commissioners being of the County of Southampton and Parish of Saint
 Peter of the one part and William Drury of the same County and Parish of Saint
 Peter of the other part Witnesseth that the said David Mathews Humphrey Drury
 John Mathews and George Perry Commissioners as aforesaid for and in con-
 sideration of the sum of the sum of four hundred and twenty six dollars
 current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said William Drury
 hath granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these
 presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William Drury his heirs
 to have forever two thirds of the lands of James Dour and situated
 lying and being in the State County and Parish of Sussex containing
 a total survey made by the County Surveyor 136 acres but the same more
 or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a Black gum in
 Charles Harrisons line in the lane and a acre or more William Drury and
