This Indenture made this 29th day of December in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and thirty one between James Stinson and Sarah his wife of the one part and Samuel S. Turner of the other part each of the county of Southampton and State of Virginia testimony that the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Samuel S. Turner the receipt whereof they the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife do hereby acknowledge they the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife doth bargain sell alien and confirm and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Samuel S. Turner his heirs and assigns forever one certain part or parcel of Land containing by a late survey fifty five and one half acres situate the same upon or left and bounded as follows beginning at a Hickory in the head of a Run running north to two black gums near the head of a small branch thence down the course corner of that branch to a large poplar near where the said branch crosses in deep water pond thence east up a slash to a maple standing in the head of the Run thence the same course to two small pines a corner of said Stinson and said Land thence south to the beginning it being a part of the Land the said James Stinson purchased at the sale of Peyton Barnes and Legister with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife and people thereof to have and to hold the said part or parcel of Land and all and singular the premises hereby bargained and sold or mentioned or intended to be with their and every of their heirs heirs and assigns to the only proper use of the said Samuel S. Turner and his heirs forever and the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife and their heirs forever manant and forever defend the premises aforesaid unto the said Samuel S. Turner his heirs and assigns forever against all and every person or persons whatsoever in witness whereof the said James Stinson and Sarah his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and Year first above written
