This Indenture made this 14th day of May 1822 the year 1822 Between Mercurius P. Boraham of the first part and Francis P. Williamson of the second part Whereas by a certain deed of Trust executed by Henry Melk for the benefit of James A. Gray the said Mercurius P. Boraham was authorized empowered instructed and directed to sell to the highest bidder certain property therein mentioned and thereby thereupon to make Lawful Conveyance to the purchaser and the said Francis P. Williamson having become the purchaser of a Lot in (named Commonly called the Brick House or such interest therein as the said Mr. P. Boraham could lawfully apart withale by virtue of the above mentioned Deed in Trust - - - Now This Indenture witnesses that the said Mercurius P. Boraham for and in consideration of the premises and the undertaking of the said Francis P. Williamson to pay to him the said Mercurius P. Boraham the sum of ten thousand dollars on or before the first day of January 1823 hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell to the said Francis P. Williamson this then to a certain Lot of Land in (named Commonly called the Brick House containing about one and a half acres lying and being on both sides of the Street or public road and designated on the map or plat of manner by or such interest therein as the said Mercurius P. Boraham by virtue of the said deed in Trust might lawfully sell with all and singular the rights and appurtenances thereto in anywise Commingling in anywise pertaining or belonging to the said Lot of Land together with the profits and advantages whatsoever to the said Lot belonging or appurtenant or with the same uses and enjoys or accepts respectively taken in the said part parcel or number thereof to him his heirs and assigns forever to the only
