This Indenture made this 30th day of September in the Year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty two between Lewis Worrell of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Thomas B. Worrell of the same County and State of the other part testifies that the said Lewis Worrell for and in consideration of the sum of five thousand dollars current money of the Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said Thomas B. Worrell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give bargain and sell unto the said Thomas B. Worrell his heirs forever the certain tracts or parcels of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton being a part of the Lands of John Whitehead dead which was purchased by said Lewis Worrell as will appear from the records of said County lying on the South side of Stonyway River in the Parish of Saint Lukes adjoining the Lands of William Allen Trust. The first tract or parcel of Land including the plantation whereon said John Whitehead formerly resided and the Plantation or Lot of Land that was allotted to Archimede Whitehead at the division of the Lands that was at the death of said John Whitehead was purchased by said Lewis Worrell after the death of the said Archimede Whitehead of the Commissioners both included contained by a late Survey Three hundred and twenty four and half acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at a large white oak standing in Arthur's Swamp a corner of William Allen's Land thence along said William Allen's Land P 85 E 226 Poles to a red oak where is variation or corner of said William Allen thence South 20 E 190 Poles to a Hickory at the path appointed the thence thence South 20 E 66 Poles to a turn of the road thence S 62 W 118 Poles thence S 49 W 102 Poles to the corner of the aforesaid Arthur's Swamp thence up the run of the said Stream the various courses thereof to the first Station also the second Parcel or parcel of Land lying adjoining said William Allen's Land and the Lands that formerly belonged to John Davids contained by a late survey thirty seven and a half acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at a new corner of said Lands made in William Allen's old line a new corner of said Lands to wit running thence due north 10 poles to a small Gum a corner of William Allen on the side of the Pond thence N 75 W 138 Poles to a small sweet gum corner of the said William Allen thence S 84 W 144 Poles to a
