This Indenture made this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and twenty two between Willie Soper of the first part and of the County of  
Southampton and State of Virginia and Jordan Soper of the said County and State of  
the other part witnesseth that the said Willie Soper for and in consideration of the  
sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars and twenty five cents to him in hand  
paid by the said Jordan Soper at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents  
the receipt whereof the said Willie Soper hath bargained sold and confirmed unto the  
said Jordan Soper his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate  
lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia in said State  
parish and containing by estimation one hundred and forty acres be the same  
more or less and bounded as follows that is to say bounded by Evans Soper line  
thence Bellings St Barres line thence James Hartens line thence Augustus Phelps  
line to Thomas Persons line to the beginning together with the several meadows
