This Indenture made this 21st day of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Twenty two and Witnessed by Richard H. Blow of the one part and Elizabith Bryant of the other part testifying that the said Richard H. Blow for consideration of the sum of Eighty five dollars and thirty three and 3/4 cents by the sum above being paid by the said Richard H. Blow in hand paid on before the witness and delivery of this present instrument to her the said Elizabith Bryant the said Richard H. Blow has granted bargained sold and by his signature as grantor has alienated to the said Henry Bailey his heirs and assigns the one third part of one tenth of a certain tract here a parcel of Land lying in the town of Southampton being part of the land which Hugh and Anna purchased of Eason Post and their son Mr & Mrs Shadrack community called the Great Stone Tract and bounded as follows Beginning at the post at the head of the Ditch purchased by John Blow & it goes to the grave of Peter Hause took by a small tributary in a branch there the same goes to a small crooked pine in the edge of a small fenced thicket branch along the river on a ridge or bank of cleare ground to a large pine in the corner of the land formerly owned by Captain Tuck purchased from Eason Post from thence about thirty or forty paces further to a large standing pine tree on the same ridge in a north west angle etc a course to a large pine tree a black from thence up the side of the back to a line into a corner tree then down a straight line over a right angle to the upper corner formerly William Post's lot from thence along the back line forming part of the lot of Doctor Brown Post William Garrison Post and Charles Tuck Post to the first station which bounds were supposed were set off to contain an acre or two as the same now or by the one third of one tenth of the tract part of the lots in the town of Southampton on the 1st or 19th January 1819 formerly owned by Capt. Edmund H. Lee to have and to hold the said Post and Post's one acre and twenty nine and a half rods to be granted and sold with all the appurtenances together with all dars audiences and entites touching or in any way concerning the same to the said Henry Bailey his heirs and assigns for ever and the said Richard H. Blow to have the said tract and parcel of Land and Post being numbered to be granted and sold with this appurtenances unto the said Henry Bailey his heirs and assigns against all and every other person or persons claiming by him or under him doth seal and will warrant and confirm the same to be held by the said Richard H. Blow his heirs and assigns aforesaid and the said Henry Bailey shall have full warrant and power to defend the same to the best of his power and the day and year above written

This Indenture made this 24th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two and twenty two and three quarters of the sum of two dollars in hand paid by the said Elizabith Bryant of William Tuck for consideration of the sum above being paid by the said Elizabith Bryant of William Tuck the receipt being fully acknowledged both bargained sold and delivered unto the said Elizabith Bryant of William and to his heirs forever one certain house and lot of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and in the parish of Saint Peter and being a part of the Town which I have been in at a stately tree with its boughs together with all rights still purging and interest whereof I the said William Tuck have heretofore may have or now have to the said house and lot of Land and to the said Elizabith Bryant of William and her heirs forever to be the only proper and lawful heir of the said Elizabith Bryant of William and the said William Tuck for himself to his heirs forever granted and delivered the title of the aforesaid house and lot of Land and every part thereof against all and every person or persons whatsoever In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the day and year above mentioned
