This Indenture made this 22nd day of August in the year of Christ 1822 Between George Curley and Lucy his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Alfred Stacy of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Curley and Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars to them hourly a knowledge hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Alfred Stacy his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing two hundred acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows beginning at the mouth of the long branch thereof down Arthur's swamp to the mouth of a small branch thereof by 3 lines of marked trees to the line now belonging to John Harwood thence down that line to the said long branch thence down the said branch to the beginning To have unto to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the appointances thereof belonging to him the said Alfred Stacy his heirs and assigns to the use and behoof of the said Alfred Stacy his heirs and assigns forever unto the said George Curley and Lucy for themselves their heirs Executors administrators with kind consent and agree to and with the said Alfred Stacy his heirs and assigns that they the said George Curley and Lucy their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with the appointances unto him the said Alfred Stacy his heirs and assigns against them the said George Curley and Lucy their heirs and against all persons whomsoever shall by their presents grant warrant and defend foreverthorow of the said George Curley and Lucy hath hereunto set their hands and affixes their seals the day and Year above written

This Indenture made this eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty five Between William D. Small and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Fanny Westbrok of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the value of the said premises and agreement hereafter recited and contained and stated by and on the part of the said Fanny Westbrok her Executors and assigns are to be paid done and performed unto the said William D. Small and Mary his wife held bargain and conveyance certain tract of land lying on the North side of Jones branch supposed to be six acres or less unto the said Fanny Westbrok her Executors administrators and assigns a part of the tract of land whereon the said William D. Small and Mary his wife have been lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a dead maple and thence along the said Ramsey line to a dog hole and thence to the beginning with all the appointances thereof and the said Fanny Westbrok to have the privilege of clearing and cutting the said land just as the said William D. Small and Mary his wife once has done in this run right also the said Fanny Westbrok is to get timber in any other part of the said William D. Small and Mary his wife land of request to have and to hold the said parcel or tract of land unto her the said Fanny Westbrok her Executors and assigns for and during the term of ten Years for the consideration of sum of money to be hereafter given and lawful money of the commonwealth to him the said William D. Small and Mary his wife in hand paid by the said Fanny Westbrok or her assigns
