This Indenture made this 22nd day of August in the year of Christ 1722 Between George Curley and Lucy his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Alfred Stuy of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Curley and Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty shillings to them hereby a knowledge hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Alfred Stuy his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows beginning at the mouth of the long branch thereof downe Arthur's Swamp to the mouth of a small branch thereof by 2 lines of marked trees to the line now belonging to John Marquand thereof that lye to the said long branch thereof downe the said branch to the beginning To have unto to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Alfred Stuy his heirs and assigns to the use and behoof of the said Alfred Stuy his heirs and assigns forever unto the said George Curley and Lucy for themselves their heirs Executors administrators with their consent and assent and with the said Alfred Stuy his heirs and assigns that they the said George Curley and Lucy their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto him the said Alfred Stuy his heirs and assigns against them the said George Curley and Lucy their heirs and against all persons whomsoever shall by their presents found warrant and defende do wronge or suffer of the said George Curley and Lucy hath hereunto set their hands and affixes their seals the day and Year above written

This Indenture made this eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty two Between William D. Small and Lucy his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Westbrok of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the value convenient and agreement hereafter recorded and contained and stated by and on the part of the said James Westbrok his Executors and assigns are to be paid done and performed unto the said William D. Small and Lucy his wife held bargain and conveyed certain tract of Land lying on the North side of said branch supposed to be six acres or less more or less unto the said James Westbrok his Executors administrators and assigns a part of the tract of Land whereon the said William D. Small and Lucy his wife do hereby now lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a dead maple and thence along the said Runway line to a dog hole and thence to the beginning with all the appurtenances thereof and the said James Westbrok to have the privilege of draining and cutting the said Land just as the said William D. Small and Lucy his wife comes has done in this run right also the said James Westbrok is to get timber in any other part of the said William D. Small and Lucy his wife Land if required to have and to hold the said parcel or tract of Land unto the said James Westbrok his Executors and assigns for and during the term of ten Years for the consideration of sum of money to be hereafter given and lawful money of the Commonwealth to him the said William D. Small and Lucy his wife in hand paid by the said James Westbrok his Executors
