This Indenture made and entered into this second day of February Eighteen hundred  
and twenty two between James Jordan and Mary Jordan his wife of the County  
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Tom Hill of the same County  
and the State of the other part witnesseth that the said James Jordan and Mary Jordan  
his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and thirty three dollars  
to them in hand paid by the said Tom Hill at or before the execution and delivery of these  
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents  
do bargain and sell unto the said Tom Hill his heirs and assigns a certain parcel of  
Land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton being the tract or parcel of  
Land given to the said James Jordan by Benjamin Stottfield dead and bounded as follows in  
the following named persons lands to wit Sam Corbin less Samuel Cooks less Col Edward  
dead less and the Lands now owned by the said Tom Hill the said parcel of Land containing  
by estimation sixty five and a half acres of Land to the same more or less together with all its  
concurrents advantages emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging  
appertaining and annexed and remaining and remaining constant profits though to have and to let the  
said parcel of Land and every part thereof unto the said Tom Hill his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only
