This Indenture made this 10th day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty and between Amos Syner and Nancy Syner his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Jordan Syner of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Amos Syner and Nancy Syner his wife for and in consideration of the full and just sum of four hundred dollars current money of Virginia to be paid by the said Jordan Syner to them in hand at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Amos Syner and Nancy Syner his wife doth hereby acknowledged and therefore acquit & discharge the said Jordan Syner his heirs and assigns forever and themselves thereunto fully and entirely satisfied Contented and past have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed unto by these presents do grant bargain sell aliened conveyed and confirmed unto him the said Jordan Syner sons to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation (meadow) tract and parcel of Land wherein the said Jordan Syner now lives siting that back of purchases of Solomon Bull and wife situated lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and containing by estimation nearly acres in the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a live oak standing in the Indian branch a corner tree of said Land and James Scotts third & dividing line of marshes Tree between said land and James Scotts to a Spanish oak a corner of said Land and Haxnach Tree thence a line of marshes tree to the head of a small branch down the small branch to the Indian branch to a corner of said Land and Haxnach Tree thence up the run of the Indian branch to the beginning with all houses out houses edifices buildings woods ways water and water courses profits incidentals and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining and the acres and remainder remainder and remainder rents paid and justly thing and all the whole right title interest claims demands of them the said Amos Syner and Nancy Syner his wife of us and to the same & every part thereof.
