This Indenture made this 4th day of November 1822 between Charles Darden of the County of Stafford State of North Carolina of the one part and William Allen of the County of Surry State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Charles Darden for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid before the writing and delivery of these presents the receipt and payment is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said William Allen his heirs & assigns all my right title interest claim or demand that I now have or may have in or out of a certain tract of Lands which Allen blank conveys to my father Sabin Darden in the year 1751 and since convey to the said William Allen by Samuel Darden and wife and Mary Wells appear by their deeds to said Allen in the Clerk's office of Southampton County of Surry & bought the said land sold to the said purpose of Samuel Darden by the death of his father Sabin Darden dead To have and to hold the said bargain & premises hereby conveyed to him the said William Allen his heirs and assigns forever together with all and singular the appurtenances profits and emoluments to the same in any manner belonging In witness whereof these presents of the said Charles Darden hath hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and date above written signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of
