All to whom these presents shall come Whereas Samuel Seymour of the County of Southampton by his deeds in Trust bearing date the fifteenth day of November in the said eighth hundred and twentieth did sell and convey unto Joseph Pottler and to his heirs and assigns in Trust of Lands situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid for the consideration and clearing the payment of ten hundred and sixty five dollars and without interest therein partly due to James the 10th from the said Samuel Seymour with a right or power of redemption on the payment thereof to the said Samuel Seymour his heirs or assigns with evidence thereto in writing signed by the said Joseph Pottler and to his heirs and assigns the said Samuel Pottler the aforesaid sum of ten hundred and sixty five dollars and the interest thereon to the date hereof at 4 per cent per Annum And that the said Joseph Pottler for the consideration aforesaid have and by these presents do release and forever quit claim unto the said Samuel Seymour and to his heirs and assigns all the right title interest and to the aforesaid tract of Lands And do hereby acquit and discharge the said Samuel Seymour his heirs Executors administrators from the said debt and demand of the said Joseph Pottler my hand and seal the eighteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty five

This Indenture made this 4th day of November 1825 between Charles Darden of the County of Stafford State of North Carolina of the one part and William Allen of the County of Surry State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Charles Darden for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt and payment is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said William Allen his heirs and assigns all my right title interest claim or demand that I now have or may have in and to a certain tract of Lands which Allen Clark conveyed to my father John Darden in the year 1751 and since conveyed to the said William Allen by Samuel Darden and wife and Mary Wells appear by this deed to said Allen in the Clerk's office of Southampton County at large of the said Lands which I sell to the said William Allen by the death of my father John Clark died To have and to hold the said bargain and premises hereby conveyed to him the said William Allen his heirs and assigns forever together with all and singular the appurtenances profits and emoluments to the same in any manner belonging In witness whereof I the said Charles Darden hath hereunto set my hand and seal and affixed my seal the day and date above written signed sealed and acknowledged before me
