This Indenture made this twenty second of November Eighteen hundred and twenty two between Jordan Sygne of the first part Augustus Pope of the second part and Joseph Pope of the third part all of the County of Northampton and state of Virginia Northampton that sheweth that the said Augustus Pope bound as security for the said Jordan Sygne by bond bearing date twenty four of November Eighteen hundred and twenty two due Drury Miller for the sum of his hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty three cents also one other debt due to all the said Jordan Sygne on demand the 24th of November last above and to wit that the said Jordan Sygne hath for given consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Pope hath granted bargained sold and by these presents hath grant bargained and sold unto the said Joseph Pope his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land, to wit the Land and plantation wherein the said Jordan Sygne now resides containing one hundred and forty seven acres to the same more or less bounded by the well known standing line to land for the following intention and purposes that he the said Joseph Pope may and shall at any time hereafter being thereunto requested by either of the parties sell at Publick sale for ready money giving ten days notice the said tract or parcel of Land and out of the proceeds of such sale pay and satisfy each of the above debts Interest and costs of whatever kind of carrying the said sale into effect and the over plus if any pay unto the said Jordan Sygne him or his assigns and the the said Jordan Sygne doth hereby sell his heirs and assigns doth forever manant and defend the right title of said Land unto the said Joseph Pope with the said Joseph Pope with of release each of the parties hereunto set their hands and seals the date above written
