This Indenture made the 21st day of May in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between William Nellson and Sally his wife of the County of Surry of the one part and Joseph Washam of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Nellson and Sally his wife on their part assent the payment of sixty six dollars fifty three cents of lawful money of the Commonwealth of Virginia due to Thomas Harvis of the said County of Surry of a bill paid and now and bearing date with these presents payable on any other date and notwithstanding of what has or shall hereafter be paid by the said Joseph Washam or before the making and signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is duly acknowledged) have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do and sell unto the said grand bargain and sold unto the said Joseph Washam on certain tract or parcel of Land situate in the County of Southampton adjoining the Land of William Wallace Thomas Long John Worth and containing by estimation twenty five acres (but the same more or less) being the same tract piece or parcel of Land which descended to the said William Nellson by the death of his father to William Nellson and the same now and hereafter remain and remaineth greatly and other debts and profits thereof and of every part thereof and also all the estate right title interest trust property claim and demand whatsoever both real and personal of them the said William Nellson and Sally his wife on or out of the said Lands tenements hereditaments premises to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land herein before mentioned to be lawfully granted unto all and singular the rightful males and offspring and issue thereof belonging unto the said Joseph Washam his heirs heirs and assigns forever upon and after the death of the said Joseph Washam or any part of the within mentioned debt shall remain due and unpaid on the first day of March next ensuing the date of these presents until the said Joseph Washam shall in that behalf as soon thereafter as he conveniently can (having given twenty days of the time and place of sale of the property before mentioned or three or four of the most publick places in the neighborhood of the premises) proceed to sell the said tract or parcel of Land or so much thereof as he may deem necessary to the highest bidder for the best price that can be obtained in ready money and out of the monies arising from the sale in the first place to pay and satisfy all demands and charges attending such sale and then the debt mentioned or so much thereof as may be then due and unpaid together with the interest which shall have accrued thereupon and the residue if any) pay or write transfer to the said William Nellson his heirs heirs and assigns forever or to such person or persons as he shall by writing under his hand and seal appoint and in default of such appointment to such person or persons as shall be entitled to receive the same by virtue of the statute for the distribution of testate estate in writing of the said William Nellson & Sally his wife and Joseph Washam have hereunto set their hands & seals the day and Year first on him written above in presence of

This Indenture made the Eleventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between Henry David Williams John W. Men and Henry W. Vaughan Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton to make sale of the Lands of Abraham Mansourns deceased lying in Southampton County of the one part & John Harvis of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry David Williams John W.
