This Indenture made and executed this nineteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two by and between John Williams of Southampton and state of South Carolina of the one part and Amos Stephenson of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Williams for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars current money hereof to him by the said Amos Stephenson in hand paid the receipt whereof the said John Williams doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land which he obtained a right to by devise and the last will and testament of his father the said Williams which is duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton reference being had thereto will fully appear) the said tract or parcel of land bounded as follows to wit beginning at a post oak standing at the corner of an old field on the side of the path leading to Thomas Newsums mill thence a straight course or line to their excellent true standing stone together back of the island of a large live between Thomas Newsums said land and said Amos Stephenson thence a straight line to another well set on the side of the branch and the line of Amos Stephenson thence down the branch to the said mill swamp thence up the said branch along past Thomas Newsums Lane thence to Thomas Newsums line to the field station and suffering to contain eighty one acres or of more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all appurtenances thereto belonging to him his heirs and assigns the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Williams for himself his heirs and administrators do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns that he the said John Williams and his heirs the said tract or parcel of land with all appurtenances unto them the said Amos Stephenson his heirs and assigns against them the said John Williams and his heirs and against all persons whomsoever shall and will by their heirs forever remain and sleep in rightfulness of the said John Williams hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written
