This Indenture made the 15th day of December in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between Robert Donnell Esquire and Patsy his wife both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Selah Ellsworth of the same County and State of the other part doth witness that the said Robert Donnell for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred and fifty two dollars current money of Virginia the receipt whereof the said Patsy Donnell doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Selah Ellsworth the certain tract or parcel of Lands and premises situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and on the south side of a Tracing Road and in said Subdivided parcels and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a pine in James Donnell line thence along said Donnell line to a post or to in Thomas Donnell line to a post or in John Hott line thence from Hott line along said Doyle line to Council Ridge juncion and thence along said Doyle line to Council Ridge line to a dead pine a corner of Selah Donnell from thence along said Donnell line to the first station containing one hundred and one acres to the same measured together with all houses and houses buildings goods gardens orchards ways waters and water courses whatsoever belonging or in any way appertaining to the said tract or parcel of Land Thence and to hold the same unto the said Selah Ellsworth his heirs and his heirs forever and the said Patsy Donnell and Patsy his wife both of them their heirs executors administrators and assigns doth by these presents covenant and grant to and with the said Selah Ellsworth his heirs and assigns forever and by these presents doth warrant and forever defend the right and title claim or demands of any person or persons whatsoever claiming or demanding the same in any part or parcel thereof In witness whereof the said Patsy Donnell hath hereunto set her hand and seal the day and date before written signed sealed and declared in presence of James Jones Esquire John Spencer

Laughlin do hereby certify that Patsy Donnell wife of Robert Donnell did on the 15th of December 1822 acknowledge the within Indenture to her husband and seal and that she signed the same without the persuasion or threat of her husband and that she wished us to certify her acknowledgment to the Clerk of the County in order that this conveyance might be recorded and that she wished us to return of our minutes in hand and seal the day and date above written

On the 16th day of the 17th December 1823 This Indenture was acknowledged by Robert Donnell Esquire of Virginia with the certificate thereon endorsed expressing the acknowledgment and sworn examination of Patsy Donnell the wife of said Robert Donnell parties hereto and admitted to record and at a Court held for the purpose of the County of Southampton on the 20th January 1823 This Indenture and certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the day
