by the oaths of Joseph J. Caudell and James Hobbs of the intituled trustees and continued and in the Clerks  
office the 20<sup>th</sup> January 1823. The indenture as aforesaid was prepared by the oaths of Gers Adams  
and together with the certificate thereon executed certifying the action or signature and giving information of  
having first made of Septe North parties hereto and witness to record and at a Court held for the purpose  
County of Southampton on the 17<sup>th</sup> February 1823. This Indenture and articles so prepared and

This Indenture made this 9<sup>th</sup> day of November 1822 Between John Prince Richardson Prince William Prince  
and William Prince of the one part and Howell Myrick of the second part and William H. Brown and of the third part  
Witnesseth that whereas the said persons of the first part are indebted to the said Brown of the third part in the am-  
ount of an obligation for unexecuted and Eighty dollars due the 7<sup>th</sup> instant which they are desirous to secure by an indenture  
of the premises and of one due to them in hand paid by the said Myrick the receipt of which is acknowledged the said  
persons of the first part have bargained to give and grant and by these presents do bargain exchange and grant to  
the said Myrick all the land of which they are now seized and possessed lying on and contiguous to the land and  
lives between the County of Suffolk and Southampton just lying in each County and which they formerly possessed by  
inheritance from their father and are etc the slaves which they or either of them at this time doverseid he is  
possessed together with the stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs and all other personal estate what kind or description  
whatsoever to have and to hold the said land slaves and other estate to the said Howell Myrick for his best accord-  
and agrees for ever to have him that the said Myrick will pay him sume to obtain payment of the said land  
slaves and other estate unto default of the payment of the said debt and otherwise they or either of them shall be  
subject to the discharge the said claim of not done or otherwise the said Brown and his heirs and assigns shall require  
the said Myrick or his heirs or assigns to execute the said trust so as to pay the said debt and costs that the said  
Myrick shall have paid of above obligation his best or admt shall after having given ten days notice of the day of sale  
at Suffolk Court house door shall proceed to sell at publick auction to the highest bidder for ready money  
the said land slaves and other estate or such part and as much thereof as he may deem sufficient one half of the  
premises first lying to the said Brown the amount of the said debt and interest and discharge the costs attend-  
ing the execution of the said trust and pay over the residue in his hands to the said person of the first part  
or to such of them as no particular preference may have been directed to be done to as aforesaid. And upon this further  
trust that of the said person of the first part shall then do and may pay the said debt that then this  
indenture or to be done in full and will otherwise remain in full force and virtue so testifying whereof we have  
hereby signed our names and affixed our seals this day and date above written
